Background

The intent and overall objective of the Home and Community Care (HCC) ADI Nurse Training funding is to provide training, both in person and remotely, for HCC nurses to 1) provide opportunities for training (both in person and remotely) for HCC nurses to enhance skills and competencies and/or facilitate certification in the care and management of clients with diabetes and other chronic diseases, and learn effective strategies to improve the management of chronic diseases; and 2) implement community mentoring opportunities, such as skill development workshops and focused forums for information sharing.

HCC nurse training activities must be:

- targeted for HCC nurses (registered nurses, licensed practical nurses) to enhance skills and competencies;
- be based on established clinical practice guidelines and certified evidence-based training activities given by an accredited learning institution or from an established content expert;
- aligned with P/T guidelines and protocols for care and treatment (e.g. wound care); and
- based on regular assessments, learning needs of nurses, and evaluation of training outcomes.
