INAC will work with other government departments and NAAF to develop annual targets for take-up of NAAF programs as well as tracking procedures. Feedback and contact suggestions were provided in meetings with several parts of INAC as well as other departments in meetings in Fall 2009. NAAF has submitted a proposal to improve Aboriginal high school completions ("Realizing Projects") which is being considered by INAC's Education Branch. Tracking procedures to be used by NAAF were discussed with them in Fall 2009 and in a multi-departmental meeting January 14, 20010. Reporting on tracking procedures will be requested for NAAF's annual report for next fiscal year. AES: AES will continue to follow progress on this recommendation.
2 - NAAF should explore the possibility and potential of partnering with relevant like-minded organizations. These partnerships should be based on the common goal of improving NAAF service to currently underserved groups. Accordingly, it will eliminate the multiple, often competing, reporting demands placed on NAAF and improve the efficiency of the resources NAAF devotes to this task.	 This recommendation requires that a number of government departments coordinate and streamline their reporting and evaluation requirements, while satisfying needs with regard to accountability, value for money and measuring impacts. In addition, the Department's Policy on Transfer Payments sets out principles relating to risk-based reporting systems and continuous improvement as well as intra- and inter-departmental harmonization INAC will establish an interdepartmental working group to identify and assess current reporting demands, and to propose options which will reduce the reporting burden while not diluting reporting standards.
